We produce 380,000 bottles per year

### Our Barrel Usage

We buy 50 - 100 new French oak barrels each year.  
Our barrels are double in size, 450 liters, from "standard" barrique and are all lightly toasted.

### Our Vineyard

We have 42 hectares: all can be found in three regions;  
Canale, Monteu Roero and Castellinaldo and Montà

### Our Name:

Mal means "badly" and Vira means "situated" in local Piemontese dialect. Our name, Malvirà, refers to the original winery which was "unusually situated" facing north, instead of south-south being the typical positioning of the period.

### Founded:

The winery began under the leadership of Giuseppe Damonte, the father of Roberto and Massimo in the 1950's.
